II. FIRST EDITIONS AND MANUSCRIPTS.

51. *Biblia Pauperum*.—A block book of 40 leaves or engraved pages, wherein the Life and Passion of Christ are pictorially represented in designs from the New Testament, and further illustrated with 80 designs from parallel subjects in the Old Testament, with descriptive texts and inscriptions. [See Sotheby: *Principia Typographica*, v. 1, p. 59, et seq.] A copy of one of the very early editions, probable date 1430-40. Morgan Collection.

Following is explanation of the open pages:

The left hand page.

1st. Ham uncovering the nakedness of his father Noah.

Centre. Christ crowned with thorns.

2d. The children mocking the prophet Elijah.

The right hand page.

1st. Isaac carrying the wood for his own sacrifice.

Centre. Christ bearing the Cross.

2d. The widow of Sarepta holding two pieces of wood in the form of a cross.
